# **COVID-19 UPDATE**

Dear Employees of The Mather,

We wanted to inform you that we have learned that three residents in Independent Living and one employee in the Life Centre have tested positive for COVID-19. Note that these are new cases for today and do not include previously reported individuals. We wish these individuals a speedy recovery.

The Mather is interviewing each of these individuals to determine if he/she was in close contact with residents and/or employees (meaning within 6 feet of anyone for more than 15 minutes). Individuals who have been in close contact will be notified.

### **GET YOUR COVID-19 BOOSTER BY JANUARY 17:**

This is a reminder that Mather's COVID-19 vaccination policy requires all team members, including new hires, to receive a COVID-19 vaccination and booster by January 17, 2022, unless a reasonable accommodation and exemption from the policy is approved.

- If you have not yet received a booster, please be sure to get one and share proof of that vaccination with your HR Representative <u>before January 17</u>. (The Mather is hosting an onsite booster clinic on Tuesday, January 11. Interested employees should sign up by contacting their HR representative.
- If you have already gotten your booster, please share proof of that vaccination with your HR Representative <u>as soon as possible</u>.
- If you have questions about whether you are eligible for the COVID-19 booster, please contact your HR Representative.

### MYTHS & FACTS ABOUT COVID-19:

## MYTH: The natural immunity I get from being sick with COVID-19 is better than the immunity I get from COVID-19 vaccination.

**FACT:** Getting a COVID-19 vaccination is a safer and more dependable way to build immunity to COVID-19 than getting sick with COVID-19.

#### MYTH: The COVID-19 vaccines cause variants.

**FACT:** COVID-19 vaccines do not create or cause variants of the virus that causes COVID-19. Instead, COVID-19 vaccines can help prevent new variants from emerging.

#### MYTH: The mRNA vaccine is not considered a vaccine.

**FACT:** mRNA vaccines, such as Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna, work differently than other types of vaccines, but they still trigger an immune response inside your body.
